

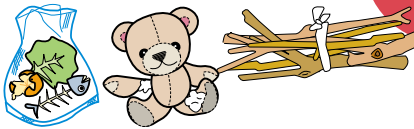
# Garbage and Recyclables Collection Schedule and Disposal Procedures

Please sort and put out your garbage and recyclables at the designated collection station no later than 8:30 a.m. on the collection day (except for neighborhoods that collect household garbage and dry-cell batteries at night).

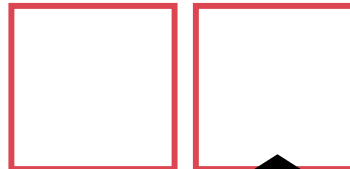

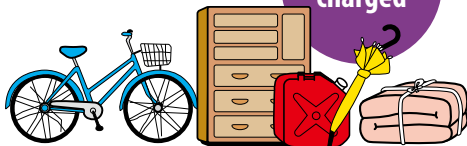

When buying a replacement

Pay the fees (recycling fee + collection/transportation fee) to the retail outlet where you are buying the replacement, and ask them to dispose of your used appliance.

When simply disposing of your used appliance

Pay the fees (recycling fee + collection/transportation fee) to the store of original purchase, and ask them to dispose of your used appliance.

If you are not able to get the store you originally purchased your used appliance from to dispose of it, please see page 12.

## What Is Food Loss?

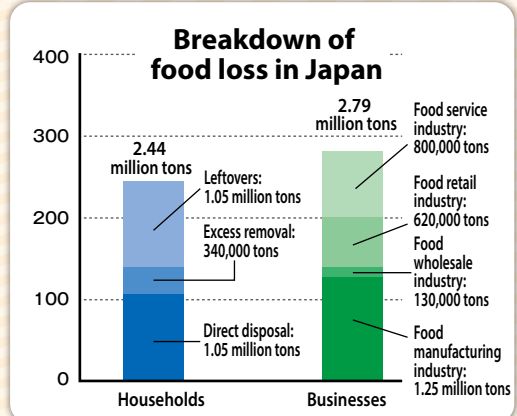
“Food loss” refers to food that goes uneaten and is thrown away for reasons such as expiration dates and leftovers.

Food loss in Japan amounted to approximately 5.23 million tons\* in FY2021, which is about 1.2 times the amount of food aid the United Nations World Food Programme provided that same fiscal year (4.4 million tons\*).

General households are responsible for nearly half of food loss, which means that both businesses and consumers need to work together to reduce food loss.

With a sense of *mottainai* (regret about waste) in your heart, please do your best to eat all the food you buy in a fun and delicious way.

### ● Tips for reducing food loss

#### Always check the contents of your refrigerator before buying food

Check what food you have in your refrigerator before shopping, and check expiration dates as well.

#### Difference between “best before” and “use by”

Make a habit of checking to see if foods past their “best before” date (賞味期限) are still edible (with a “use by” date), rather than immediately throwing them away. The “best before” date is a guideline for the quality of the food and does not indicate whether it is safe to eat.

#### Cook creatively

Adjust the amount of food you cook to reduce leftovers. Learn about the characteristics of vegetables and other ingredients so that you can use them without waste.

### ● Take advantage of food drives if necessary

Sagamihara City runs a permanent food drive, accepting surplus food from households and donating it to food banks, welfare facilities and the like. If you have surplus food, please bring it in.



### ● Try remake recipes

Sagamihara City provides remake recipes—making dishes from leftovers—and recipes for reducing the amount of surplus food on its website. Please use it as a reference when you cook.



# Garbage When Mixed; Recyclable When Sorted Properly!



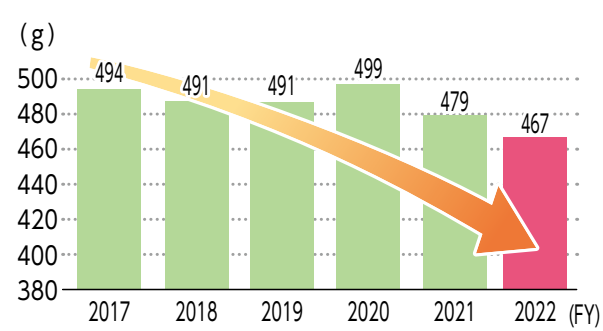
Lemon-chan

The city implements “Operation Sagami-hara Garbage DE71” under the motto “reduce by one lemon to protect the planet.” The operation’s goal is to reduce the amount of household waste each person generates each day by the weight of a lemon—approximately 100 grams.

Thanks to everyone’s cooperation, the amount of garbage each resident disposed of per day went down 27 grams—from 494 grams to 467—between 2017 and 2022.

We ask for your continued cooperation.

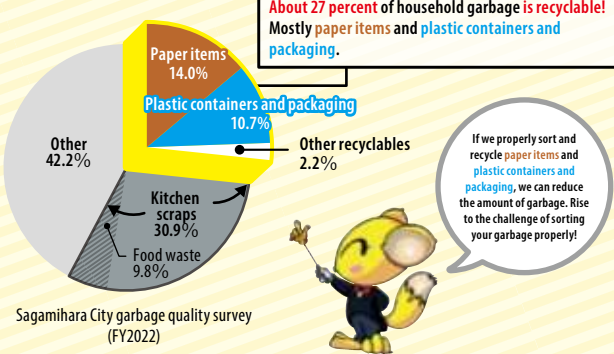

## Let's Rise to the Challenge, Starting Today! The 4Rs for Reducing Garbage

Let's follow a lifestyle that produces minimal garbage.

### Refuse

Do not buy or use items you do not need.

- ▶ Take your own shopping bag when going shopping
- ▶ Do not accept disposable chopsticks or spoons
- ▶ Avoid excessive wrapping when shopping
- ▶ Don't buy items compulsively



### Reduce

Reduce the number of items that ultimately become garbage.

- ▶ Use all food completely/don't create waste
- ▶ Purchase refillable products
- ▶ Drain kitchen scraps of water before disposal



### Reuse

Use items for as long as possible before throwing them away.

- ▶ Take advantage of flea markets and recycle shops
- ▶ Repair broken items so that you can continue using them
- ▶ Use your own thermos and chopsticks



### Recycle

Recycle items that can be used again.

- ▶ Sort garbage and recyclables (cans, bottles, old paper, etc.) before disposal
- ▶ Turn kitchen scraps into compost







# Household Garbage

Twice a week

Take your bagged items to the garbage and recyclable collection station on the collection day designated for household garbage.



Put your trash in a **transparent or semitransparent bag** and close the opening securely. The size and weight of each bag should be easy to handle and carry with one hand.

Notes: 1. Please see pages 10 through 11 concerning large-size garbage, and note that some items are considered **large-size garbage** regardless of their size.  
2. You can bring in large amounts of household garbage. See page 16 for where you can do this.

Be sure to drain kitchen scraps of water.

## Plastic items

Items that are fifty centimeters or larger on any side are considered **large-size garbage**.



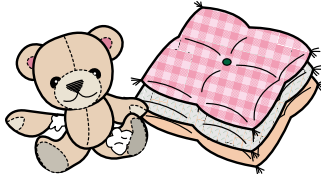
Items with the identifying "Pla" mark should be disposed of as plastic containers and packaging (see page 8).

## Tree branches and grass



Cut branches to ten centimeters or less in thickness and less than fifty centimeters in length, and tie them in bundles with string before disposal. Grass clippings should be bagged.

## Stuffed toys, cushions, etc.

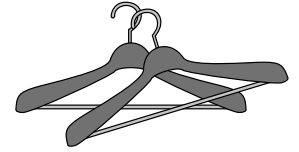


Futons are considered **large-size garbage**. Carpets and rugs measuring fifty centimeters in length or longer are considered **large-size garbage**.

## Footwear such as shoes and slippers



## Hangers



Please dispose of hangers in limited numbers. Notes:  
1. Some cleaners accept used cleaner hangers.  
2. Dispose of wire hangers as recyclables (metal items).

## Disposable and cloth diapers

Flush the waste down the toilet.



## Electrical items such as clocks and hair dryers

(Some collection boxes collect these items (see page 9).)



Items in this category that are thirty centimeters or larger on any side are considered **large-size garbage**.

## Ceramic items such as teacups; items that can easily break such as cups and mirrors; dangerous items such as blades (including broken items)

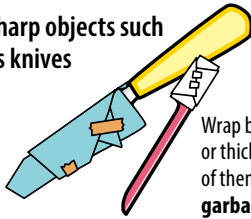


Wrap the above items in cloth, newspaper or thick paper to ensure safety, and dispose of them with your household garbage.

# Be Careful When Disposing of Hazardous Garbage!

Hazardous garbage can lead to injury of collection staff or to fires in the collection trucks. Be sure to follow the rules when disposing of hazardous items.

## Sharp objects such as knives



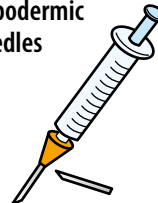
Wrap blades in newspaper or thick paper, and dispose of them with **household garbage**

## Lighters



Use the contents of lighters completely and dispose of them with **household garbage**

## Hypodermic needles



Bring these needles to a **medical facility or another place** that collects and disposes of them. If your regular medical facility does not collect them, place them in a durable container such as a PET bottle so the needles do not stick out, and then dispose of them along with household waste.

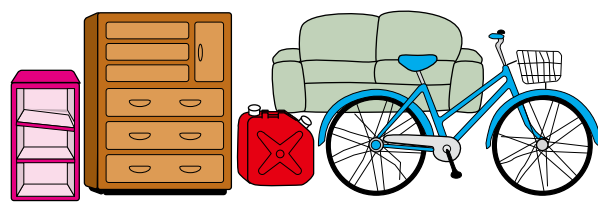

# Dry-Cell Batteries

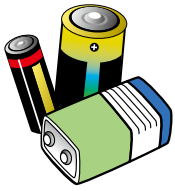
Once a week

Put these batteries on the side at the garbage and recyclable collection station on the second household garbage collection day of the week.

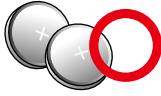


Place your batteries in a **transparent or semitransparent bag** separate from your household garbage.

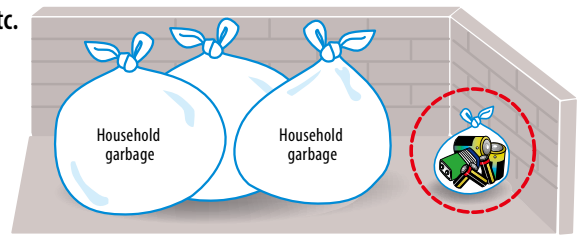
Manganese, alkaline, Oxryide dry-cell batteries; CR and BR coin-type batteries; etc.

## Button-type batteries (LR, SR or PR)

Please consult an electronic shop.

Note: Including metal-air electrochemical cells batteries.



Use cellophane tape to stop the batteries from discharging electricity.

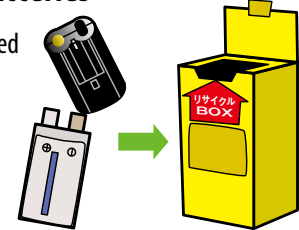

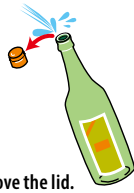
Take items to the garbage and recyclable collection station on the collection day designated for recyclables.



Sort your items according to type.

## Bottles

Bottles for beverages, such as juice or whiskey; bottles for food, such as coffee, spices and tsukudani seaweed



Remove the lid. Dispose of metal lids with cans.



Dispose of plastic lids along with plastic containers and packaging.

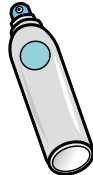
Rinse the inside of the bottles and place them in a transparent or semitransparent bag.

## Cans

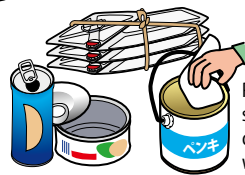
Beverage cans, such as for juice or beer; canned food cans; spray cans; gas cassettes; paint cans; itto (18-liter) cans; etc.



Do not pierce a hole in spray cans and gas cassettes. Make sure they are completely empty, place in a separate bag (transparent or semitransparent) from other cans, and label the bag "スプレー缶 (spraying can)."



Empty the cans completely, rinse, crush as flat as possible, and put them in a transparent or semitransparent bag.



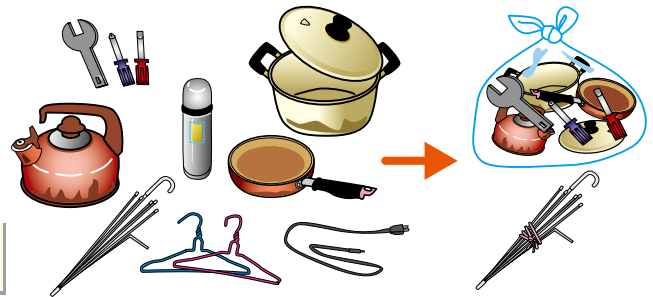
Paint cans—make sure they are completely empty, and wipe the inside lightly before disposal.

## Metal items

Items mostly made of metal measuring less than fifty centimeters on their largest side; kitchen items that can be fit into a 45-liter transparent or semitransparent bag (items fifty centimeters or larger on any side are accepted) such as frying pans; wire hangers, wire umbrella frames (remove the cloth parts of the umbrella and dispose of them as household garbage), electrical cords, etc.



Wash the inside and place the items in a transparent or semitransparent bag.

## Cloth items

Used clothes (including suits, kimono, leather clothes, down jackets), bags (except ones with wheels), belts, hats, towels, sheets, blankets, curtains, etc.



Place the items in a transparent or semitransparent bag.



Since these items will not be recyclable if they are wet, please do not dispose of them on a rainy day.

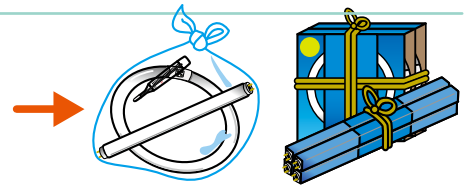


Items with cotton inside, such as cushions; uniforms; judo gear; items that are dirty or torn; cloth items used by animals ▶ Household garbage (Please dispose of these items in small amounts.) Note: Futons are considered large-size garbage.

## Fluorescent lights and mercury thermometers



Light bulb types and compact types are also collected.



Place the items in the cases you originally purchased them in and bundle them with string, or place them in a transparent or semitransparent bag so that they will not break.



Broken items, LED light bulbs, incandescent light bulbs and alcohol thermometers (with red liquid) ▶ Household garbage



Do not bundle items with packing tape.

## Used cooking oil



Use cooking oil up completely if at all possible; if any oil remains, recycle it.

Pour the oil into a plastic PET bottle whose label is removed, and close the lid securely before disposal. (Please use 500-milliliter containers if at all possible.)



Do NOT pour oil into a container while it is still hot.




Dispose of items without placing them in a bag.

## It is prohibited to take recyclables from garbage and recyclable collection stations!

According to the Sagami-hara City ordinance concerning the promotion of waste reduction, recycling and proper handling, no one other than companies contracted by the city is allowed to collect or transport recyclables that have been taken to a garbage and recyclable collection station.

**Violation of this ordinance is punishable by a fine of up to ¥200,000.**

If you see someone taking recyclables from your collection station, please note the date and time, location, characteristics of the person and vehicle removing the recyclables, the license plate number and type of recyclables removed, and then report what you've seen to the Environmental Affairs Office with jurisdiction over your neighborhood or the Tsukui Clean Center.



# Plastic Containers and Packaging

Once a week

Take your bagged items to the garbage and recyclable collection station on the designated collection day for plastic containers and packaging.



Sort items according to type before disposal.

## Warning

Use up the contents and rinse lightly or wipe off any stains before disposal. If you cannot remove any stains, please dispose of it as **household garbage**. (Unclean items may cause other items to soil, which makes them unrecyclable.)



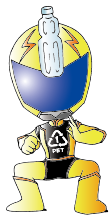

Please choose either of the above methods to dispose of your used item properly.

Note: Large-size garbage from commercial businesses is not collected by Sagami-hara City.

The term "large-size garbage" refers to relatively large items such as furniture, bicycles and bedding, as well as home appliances that are small but must be crushed before incineration. In general, it refers to items 30 cm or larger for electrical appliances, and around 50 cm to 2 m for other items.

Some small items may also be considered large-size garbage depending on their material and shape.

### ① Collection from your home

#### ① Apply for collection

- We will tell you the earliest collection day available depending on the order of reservations. We may not be able to collect your items for a while at the end of the year and fiscal year, since those periods are typically very crowded, so please apply well in advance. You can specify a date up to two months in advance.

- Application ▶▶ When you apply for pickup, we will tell you your reservation number, the handling fee, collection date and where to take your used item. Please be sure to write the information down. If you apply via the Internet, you will be notified by email at a later date.

#### ② Paying handling fees

Buy large-size garbage collection stickers in the necessary amount at any shop that offers them.  
Note: Make sure the stickers are stamped with a receipt date.



You will need to apply to the reception office in advance.

#### ③ Take your item to the designated collection site

Write your name or reception number on the large-size garbage collection stickers and attach them to the respective item(s). Take your used items to the designated site no later than 8:30 a.m. on the collection day. You cannot specify the time.



#### ④ Collection

The large-size garbage collection staff will collect your item from the designated site.

You do not need to be present at the time your items are collected.



The staff will not collect items from inside your home.  
Note: This excludes large-size garbage welfare fureai collection (see below).

#### Large-size garbage collection stickers

#### Designated collection site

For single-family housing: Beside the gate of the property

For communal housing: A visible location on the ground floor (confirm the location with the building manager beforehand)

- There is only one type of collection sticker, which costs ¥400. **Please purchase enough collection stickers for the handling fee amount** the reception office indicates.  
Example: If the handling fee is ¥1,600, purchase four ¥400 stickers.
- Write your name or reservation number and pickup date on the sticker. Items with blank stickers will not be collected. You can check your reservation number when you apply.
- Items without stickers, insufficient fees, items that are different from those you applied for and items that you have not applied for cannot be collected.
- If there are any uncollected items, an uncollected item notification form will be left. Please contact the Large-size Garbage Reception Office to find out what to do.
- Stickers are nonrefundable and cannot be reissued. Check the amount before purchasing collection stickers.
- Stickers for other municipalities cannot be used.

#### Application by postcard

You can also apply for a pickup **by postcard**. Address your postcard to the Kita Sanitation Plant, and provide your name, address, telephone number (daytime telephone number), where you will put your large-size garbage, the type of large-size garbage, and the number of items. You will be notified of the collection day at a later date.

#### Large-size Garbage Welfare Fureai Collection

This is a program for residents who are not able to take their large-size garbage to a designated site, such as those sixty-five years of age or older or disabled people who live alone. There are restrictions on the collection days and the amount that can be collected.

The Nanbu and Hokubu Large-size Garbage Reception facilities do not accept household garbage, dry-cell batteries, recyclables or plastic containers and packaging. You can bring household garbage and dry-cell batteries to the Minami Sanitation Plant or the Kita Sanitation Plant, and recyclables and plastic containers and packaging to the Asamizodai Recycle Square or Hashimotodai Recycle Square. The Tsukui Clean Center accepts large-size garbage as well as household garbage, dry-cell batteries, recyclables and plastic containers and packaging. See page 16 for more details.

### Handling fee

#### 1 Reception

Complete the application form at the reception service counter, and obtain a weight card.



#### 2 Initial weighing

Drive your car (containing your large-size garbage) onto the facility's scale, and measure the total weight.



#### 3 Unload the large-size garbage

Under the instructions of the staff, bring your large-size garbage into the facility.



#### 4 Second weighing

Drive your car onto the facility's scale after unloading your garbage, and measure its weight.



#### 5 Payment

Bring the weight card at the payment counter and pay the handling fee.

# Discover and Experience the 4Rs at a Recycle Square

At a Recycle Square facility, you can find out how to reduce and recycle household garbage based on the 4Rs (refuse, reduce, reuse, and recycle).

## ■ Selling reused furniture to residents for a small fee

Still-usable furniture collected as large-size garbage is cleaned, repaired, etc. and sold to residents for a small fee. (If multiple applicants want the same piece of furniture, we will hold a lottery.)

**Facility hours:** 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

**Eligibility:** City residents who are junior high school age and above (one application per person per month)

**Exhibition period:** 1st to 15th of every month (daily); 5th to 15th in January

**Announcement:** sixteenth of each month

We will announce the application numbers for those chosen around 1 p.m.

**Note:** In addition to having their names being posted at the facility, those chosen will be notified via postcard.

**Delivery period:** Between the announcement until 4 p.m. on the 26th of each month.

**Note:** You will be charged a small fee to cover part of the reuse fee, based on the size of the furniture.

## ■ Book reuse service available

The city has a Reuse Book Collection service to encourage residents to recycle books that can still be read.

**Eligibility:** Residents of Sagami-hara City

**Taking books:** Tell the service counter that you want to take some books from the Reuse Book Collection (up to three books per day per person). There is a limit of twelve books per month.

**Providing books:** Bring in the books you want to donate and go to the service counter.

**Note:** We may not be able to accept certain books depending on their condition, content and availability of space in the Reuse Book Collection.

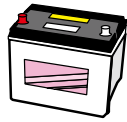
# The City Cannot Handle Some Items
